Methodology & Approach

Methodology and Approach:

□Sample size: 5,836

Confidence level: 99percent and MoE of 1.69percent

The Electoral Commission's 2020 voters register was used as sample frame.



□ 30 percent of constituencies from each region was randomly selected and allocated the regional quota based on total voters in each of those constituencies.

Global Info Analytics Chalgies Poils Modelling Chalgies Poils Modelling The results of the primaries and general elections head-to-head are based on "likely voters" model which exclude responses of voters who have indicated they will not vote in the primaries or the general elections in December 2024.

The poll is cross-sectional.

Demographic analysis of the results would have a MoE above the overall poll's MoE.

□ Respondents were selected randomly from 82 constituencies in all the 16 regions of Ghana.

□Field interviews were conducted between 31st March and 9th April 2023

Executive Summary

EXECTUIVE SUMMARY

- Global Info Analytics
- A new national poll released by Global InfoAnalytics for the month of April 2023 shows the president's job approval rating taking a nose dive after making a recovery in January 2023. The poll shows 65 percent of voters disapproving his performance, up from 59 percent in January, while 29 percent approve of his performance, down from 32 percent. 58 percent of NPP supporters approve the president's performance and 38 percent disapprove. For the NDC, 11 percent approved his job performance whilst 86 percent disapproved his performance. Additionally, 15 percent of floating voters approved of his performance compared to 77 percent who disapproved his performance.
- 71 percent of voters believed Ghana is headed in the wrong direction, unchanged from January 2023 poll.
 19 percent believed it is headed in the right direction and a further 10 percent did not have opinion.
- For the NPP primaries, the poll shows Hon. Kennedy Ohene Agyapong (KOA) surging among general voters but not enough to overtake Hon Alan Kwadwo Kyeremanten (AKK) and H.E. Mahamudu Bawumia (DMB) in the race to lead the NPP into the 2024 elections.
- ❑ KOA now attracts 23 percent of votes when voters were asked to indicate their preference for the NPP leadership. AKK stills leads DMB, 30 percent to 29 percent among all voters. However, among NPP affiliates, DMB still has slender lead over AKK. DMB now attracts 39 percent of NPP votes, AKK attracts 37 percent and KOA, 23 percent.

- However, in the event of runoff, the poll shows AKK leading DMB 57 percent to 43 percent among all voters and by 53 percent to 47 percent among NPP voters.
- For the NDC race, H.E. John Dramani Mahama (JDM) is set to clinch his party's nomination when polls open on 13th May 2023 as he leads his closest rivals Dr Kwabena Duffuor (DKD) 75 percent to 17 percent with Hon Kojo Bonsu in distance third with 8 percent of the votes. However, among NDC affiliates, John Mahama leads Dr Duffuor 93 percent to 4 percent and Kojo Bonsu(KB) with 3 percent.
- For the general elections, JDM leads all the NPP frontrunners. JDM leads AKK 54 percent to 40 percent with further 6 percent intend to vote for someone else. JDM also leads DMB 55 percent to 38 percent; 7 percent intend to vote for someone else.
- KOA is currently very competitive against JDM in what could be termed a meteoric rise in the poll. KOA now trails JDM 38 percent to 55 percent with 7 percent intending to vote someone else. In January, KOA trailed JDM by 31 percent to 63 percentage.




- On the question of whether the NPP can "break-the-eight", 27 percent of voters believed the party can "break-the-eight" while 58 percent said they can't, and 15 percent have no opinion.
- The NDC is predicted to have a majority in the next parliament if elections were held today, according the generic parliamentary poll. Approximately 43 percent of voters intend to vote for NDC parliamentary candidates in the upcoming general elections compared to 36 percent who indicated they intend to vote for NPP candidates.
- In what could be a challenge for the governing NPP which has 137 members of parliament, the poll revealed that 13 percent of NPP supporters intend to vote for NDC parliamentary candidates in December 2024 compared to 5 percent for the NDC. 17 percent of NPP supporters are unsure if they will vote for their candidates compared to 7 percent for the NDC.
- Less than half of voters support the NDC MPs decision to approve the president's ministerial nominees against their party directives as 45 percent supported the approval compared to 33% who opposed the decision.
- ❑ Voters were however supportive of the decision of the NDC party to change the leadership in parliament. 42 percent support the changes compared to 29 percent who did not support and further 29% expressed no opinion about the decision. Surprisingly, there is cross-party support the decision to change the leadership as 40 percent of NPP affiliates, 49 percent of NDC and 41 percent of Floating Voters support the changes.

How do you describe your standard of living in the last 12 months

























Voting intentions of KOA voters in DMB v AKK Runoff – NPP Affiliates







Voters who intend to switch their votes in the Parliamentary Elections in 2024

- 5 percent of NDC affiliated voters plan to vote for NPP Parliamentary Candidates, 2 percent will vote for other parties' candidates, 7 percent are not about who to vote for and 2 percent said they will not vote.
- For the NPP, 13 percent will note for NDC parliamentary candidates, 3percent will vote for candidates from other parties, 18 percent were not sure about who they will note for and 5 percent said they will not vote all.
